The 'Creating & Sharing' module is about content, content, content: user-generated content (UGC), peer-to-peer content sharing (P2P), website content, mash-ups, videos, images, copying and pasting, downloading and uploading, file types and file saving.

Sometimes it's appropriate to create and share content and to put it out there, on the Internet and via email; sometimes it's best not to. However, it can be difficult to know what to do and when.

Digital rights and responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• When to share and when not to share content online• Respecting the rights of others and content that they have created (e.g. music, images)• Understanding 'Acceptable Use' agreements• What is plagiarism and copyright? When does it apply?• When do you need to get someone's permission to use/post their stuff online?• When are things free to use? When and why does online content cost money?
Inappropriate and illegal uploads/downloads	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• How can you find out if posting something online is irresponsible or even illegal?• Do you know when to be careful about sharing things online? Can you respect the rights and feelings of others?
Creating/sharing pictures and videos	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do you know how images and videos are shared online?• Do you know where they might end up and how?• How long will this content last on websites, on smart phones etc.?• When are you allowed to use other people's images?
