Parent Contribution payments

Our preferred method of payment is **via COMPASS**. The Parent Contribution payments can be made in full or via the featured instalment option of x3 payments at the start of Term 1, Term 2 and Term 3. If these payment arrangements present difficulties please contact the office to discuss alternative means and plans for your contribution.

Requests for refund are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school identifies it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration the relevant circumstances, details and costs that have been incurred.

Stationery Packs



Stationery Packs have been made available through our preferred supplier [Rapid Office Supplies](https://schoolpacks.com.au/morangas) - (<https://schoolpacks.com.au/morangas>) for your child to individually own and use.

Please be sure to place your order before the cut off date, which is the 3rd of Jan, 2025.

To order your Stationery pack:

1. Select the year level required for order
2. Please ensure that the students' first and surname is entered
3. Select 'Add to Cart'
4. If purchasing more than one Student Pack, please select 'Continue Shopping', then click 'Home' in the top left corner of the screen, and follow the same procedure from step 3
5. Select 'Proceed to checkout'
6. Your total payment amount required will display on screen
7. Enter your email address
8. Please choose your check-out option – Credit/Direct Debit available. Ensure payment details are correctly entered
9. You will receive a payment receipt and an order confirmation to the email address you provided
10. Your child's pack/s will be delivered to the school for collection

A full list of these Stationery Pack items required for each year level has also been provided through Compass. This can be accessed by opening Compass in the browser, selecting the 'Community' icon along the top of the page, and clicking into 'School Documentation'. Pencil Case Essentials

Parents will be sent home a list of 'pencil case essentials' for students in Year 1 to 6 in 2025. Many of these items your child will already have from 2024, however parents are asked to check that any misplaced, broken or depleted items are replaced.

For Prep classes these 'pencil case' materials are included in the Prep Stationery Pack, and do not need to be purchased separately.

Digital Devices

In 2025, Morang South Primary School will continue to operate a personal device program for Years 3 to 6. Parents of students currently in Year 2 who will enter Year 3 in 2025, were provided with information in Term 3 **via Compass** regarding the purchase of a personal device for their child, (please see the pinned post under *My News* for detail).



In 2025, any new Year 3 to Year 6 families are also invited to purchase **one of the specified personal devices** for their child to bring to school. Morang South Primary School has made special arrangements with a preferred supplier, *Learning with Technologies (LWT)*, who offer specialised pricing, payment, warranty, insurance, set-up and configuration arrangements for parents/carers to purchase suitable devices for our students.

Financial Support for Families

Whilst Morang South Primary School makes every effort to keep the cost of contributions, stationery packs, events and activities reasonable and affordable for all parents, we understand that some families may experience financial difficulties and offer a range of support options, including:

- Personalised and flexible payment plans
- Direction to access of welfare and support agencies

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
